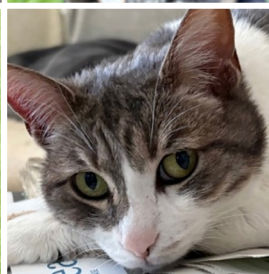
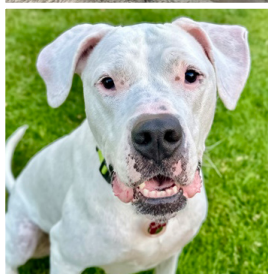

Grandmother Willow

Grandmother Willow arrived at Placer SPCA with ear deformities, severe dental disease, and was FIV+. With donor support, she received life-changing treatment, including a complex dental surgery. Today, she's thriving in a loving home, serving as a powerful reminder that compassion can give even the most vulnerable animals a second chance.



Pookie

Pookie arrived at Placer SPCA weighing just 7.2 pounds, her matted fur so severe she could barely walk. She was fragile, frightened, and needed immediate medical attention. With urgent care, a gentle foster home, and steady nourishment, she began to recover. Her story is living proof that compassionate support gives animals the chance to heal and thrive.



Zebra Cake

When Zebra Cake arrived as a stray, staff discovered severe swelling on his neck. Our veterinary team carefully removed two foreign bodies, treated his wounds and gave him pain medication, allowing him to heal comfortably. With time and care, Zebra Cake made a full recovery and was adopted shortly after, beginning his second chance with his new family.

The Guardian Angel Fund was created to make sure animals with special medical needs get the care they deserve before finding their new home. This fund helps cover the cost of important diagnostic and veterinary treatments that go beyond routine care for animals like Grandmother Willow, Pookie and Zebra Cake.

The vision our community shared for years finally became a reality. Construction of our new Veterinary & Foster Care Center was completed in 2025, culminating in a debt-free grand opening made possible by the generosity of our donors.

Rising from the ground up, the transformation unfolded before us. Marked by steady progress week by week, each phase building on the last, from framing and finishes to the installation of animal housing, medical infrastructure, and essential workspaces. By December, the facility reached full operational readiness, enabling our team to transition into a thoughtfully designed facility equipped for advanced care, recovery, and foster support.
