



Adoption Process

Thank you for choosing to adopt from the Placer SPCA. Our adoption process is designed to help create successful, lifelong matches between pets and their new families. Please review the following information and guidelines below before your scheduled visit.

ADOPTION LOCATIONS

The Placer SPCA has multiple locations where adoptions take place: Adoption & Education Center, Pet Food Express, Intake Center, and Pet Adoption & Resource Center. Addresses, hours of operation, and contact information for each facility can be found on our website at www.placerspca.org/locations.

ADOPTION FEES

All adoption fees collected assist in the daily care and on-going needs of each pet admitted to the Placer SPCA. Adoption fees vary. Please visit www.placerspca.org/adoption-pricing for more information about our adoption pricing and current promotions.

ADOPTION PACKAGE

Every adoption includes:

- Spay or neuter surgery
- Microchip
- Age-appropriate vaccinations
- Essential veterinary care appropriate for the pet's age and needs
- 30 days of complimentary pet health insurance courtesy of Fetch
- \$40 gift card for an in-person Rover training session

LOOKING TO ADD TO YOUR FAMILY?

1. Appointments

Except for Pet Food Express, appointments are required to meet adoptable pets and may be scheduled online at placerspca.org or with a Guest Services team member. **Same-day and walk-in appointments are often available at our Adoption & Education Center located at 200 Tahoe Avenue, Roseville, CA 95678, Tuesday through Sunday, 11 am to 4 pm.** To meet an adoptable animal at our Intake Facility, please allow 24 hours' notice. Adoptions are completed on a first-come, first-served basis.

2. Foster Animals

For pets currently in foster care, we require a minimum of 48 hours' notice to coordinate transportation with the foster family.

3. Age Requirement

Adopters must be 18 years of age or older and present a valid government-issued photo ID.

4. Companion Request Form

A completed [Companion Request Form](#) is required before meeting any adoptable pet. Please email your completed form to guestservices@placerspca.org before your appointment or bring a printed copy with you.

5. Household Participation

For the greatest chance of a successful adoption, we strongly encourage all members of the household to participate in selecting the pet.

6. Dog-to-Dog Introductions

If you currently have a dog, a dog-to-dog introduction may be required to determine compatibility. These introductions are scheduled as a follow-up visit. Please do not bring your resident dog to your initial appointment, as that visit is intended for you and the adoptable dog to get acquainted.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING YOUR VISIT

Our staff/volunteers will review your Companion Request form with you to learn more about what you are looking for in a pet. They'll introduce you to pets who could be a great match and share everything you should know about them, including their history, medical care, personality, and behavior. Don't be shy. We encourage you to ask all the questions you have to ensure this is the right fit for your lifestyle.

Then comes the best part: spending time together. You'll have the opportunity to interact with your potential new companion and see if the connection feels right for both of you.
